Instructions for execution of activities delineated in the Action Plan for phasing out Single Use Plastic (SUP) in State of Punjab

1) Whereas, Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change (MoEF&CC) issued a notification, dated 12 August, 2021 (Annexute-I) which mandated the banning of identified Single Use Plastic items & prescribed minimum thickness carry bag w.e.f 1st July, 2022.

2) And Whereas, as per Rule 4(2) of Plastic Waste Management (PWM) Rules, 2016 (as amended), "The manufacture, import, stocking, distribution, sale and use of following single use plastic, including polystyrene and expanded polystyrene, commodities shall be prohibited with effect from the 1st July, 2022:


 ear buds with plastic sticks, plastic sticks for balloons, plastic flags, candy sticks, ice-cream sticks, polystyrene [Thermocol] for decoration

- b) plates, cups, glasses, cutlery such as forks, spoons, knives, straw, trays, wrapping or packing films around sweet boxes, invitation cards, and cigarette packets, plastic or PVC banners less than 100-micron, stirrer
- 3) And Whereas, as per Rule 4(1)(c) of PWM Rules, 2016 (as amended), "Carry bag made of virgin or recycled plastic, shall not be less than seventy-five microns in thickness with effect from 30th September, 2021 and one hundred and twenty (120) microns in thickness with effect from 31st December, 2022".
- 4) And Whereas, in compliance of MoEF&CCs Notification, CPCB has prepared the Comprehensive Action Plan to eliminate manufacture, storage, selling, import & usage of SUPs in line with timelines specified in the notification. A copy of the Action Plan for phasing out SUP along with Timelines is annexed as Annexure-II.

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- And whereas, as per the Comprehensive Action Plan prepared by CPCB, the concerned Authorities for execution of various activities for phasing out the SUP in the State are Punjab Pollution Control Board (PPCB), Department of Local Government for urban areas, Department of Rural Development & Panchayats for rural areas, District Magistrates (DMs) & Senior Superintendents of Police (SSPs).
- And Whereas, the Assistant Director, Punjab Municipal Infrastructure Development Company (PMIDC), Department of Local Government has been nominated as Nodal Officer by the State to periodically update the action taken with regard to implementation of Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 (as amended) & phasing out of SUP on the dashboard of MoEF&CC, Government of India.
- 7) And therefore, the Government has decided to issue following instructions for phasing out SUP in the State:
 - (i) The Departments mentioned at Sr.No.5 shall ensure the compliance of the activities identified in the Action Plan for phasing out Single Use Plastic as per the prescribed timelines.
 - (ii) The Nodal Officer shall co-ordinate with the concerned Departments for getting the action taken reports for submission to MoEF&CC, Government of India.
 - (iii) The PPCB shall co-ordinate with DMs & SSPs, as indicated in the Comprehensive Action Plan for execution of activities falling in their jurisdiction.

G.S.R. 571(E).—Whereas the draft rules to amend the Plastics Waste Management Rules, 2016, were published in the Gazette of India, Extraordinary, dated the 11th March, 2021 vide notification number GSR 169 (E), inviting objections and suggestions from all persons likely to be affected thereby within a period of sixty days from the date copies of the Gazette containing the said draft rules were made available to the public;

And whereas, copies of the Gazette containing the said draft rules were made available to the public on the 11th March, 2021;

And whereas, objections and suggestions received within the aforesaid period have been duly considered by the Central Government;

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 6, 8 and 25 of Environment (Protection) Act 1986, (29 of 1986), the Central Government hereby makes the following rules to amend the Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016, namely:-

- These rules may be called Plastic Waste Management (Amendment) Rules, 2021.
 - (2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.
- 2. In the Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 (hereinafter referred to as the said rules), in rule 2, in sub-rule (1), after the word "Importers", the words, "brand-owner, plastic waste processor (recycler, co-processor, etc.)" shall be inserted.
- 3. In the said rules, in rule 3,
 - (i) after clause (n), the following clause shall be inserted, namely :-
 - '(na) "Non-woven plastic bag" means Non-woven plastic bag made up of plastic sheet or web structured fabric of entangled plastic fibers or filaments (and by perforating films) bonded together by mechanical or thermal or chemical means, and the "non-woven fabric" means a flat or tufted porous sheet that is made directly from plastic fibres, molten plastic or plastic films;'
 - (ii) after clause (q), the following clause shall be inserted, namely: -
 - '(qa) "Plastic waste processing" means any process by which plastic waste is handled for the purpose of reuse, recycling, co-processing or transformation into new products;
 - (iii) after clause (v), the following clauses shall be inserted, namely: -
 - '(va) "Single-use plastic commodity" mean a plastic item intended to be used once for the same purpose before being disposed of or recycled;'
 - '(vb) "Thermoset plastic" means a plastic which becomes irreversibly rigid when heated and hence cannot be remoulded into desired shape;'
 - '(vc) "Thermoplastic" means a plastic which softens on heating and can be moulded into desired shape;'.
- 4. In the said rules, in rule 4, -
 - (a) in sub-rule (1),-
 - (i) for the words "importer stocking", the words "import, stocking" shall be substituted;
 - (ii) in clause (c), for the words "fifty microns in thickness", the words, figures, letters and brackets "seventy five microns in thickness with effect from the 30th September, 2021and one hundred and twenty (120) microns in thickness with effect from the 31th December, 2022" shall be substituted;
 - (iii) in clause (h), after the words, "carry bags", the words "and commodities" shall be inserted;



- (iv) in clause (h), after the words, "compostable plastic carry bags", the words "or commodities or both" shall be inserted;
- (v) after clause (i), following clause shall be inserted, namely: -
- " (j) non-woven plastic carry bag shall not be less than 60 Gram Per Square Meter (GSM) with effect from the 30th September, 2021.";
- (b) after sub-rule (1), the following sub-ules shall be inserted, namely -
 - "(2) The manufacture, import, stocking, distribution, sale and use of following singleuse plastic, including polystyrene and expanded polystyrene, commodities shall be prohibited with effect from the 1" July, 2022:-
 - (a) ear buds with plastic sticks, plastic sticks for balloons, plastic flags, candy sticks, ice-cream sticks, polystyrene [Thermocol] for decoration;
 - (b) plates, cups, glasses, cutlery such as forks, spoons, knives, straw, trays, wrapping or packing films around sweet boxes, invitation cards, and eigarette packets, plastic or PVC banners less than 100 micron, stirrers.
 - (3) The provisions of sub-rule (2) (b) shall not apply to commodities made of compostable plastic.
 - (4) Any notification prohibiting the manufacture, import, stocking, distribution, sale and use of carry bags, plastic sheets or like, or cover made of plastic sheets and multi-layered packaging and single-use plastic, including polystyrene and expanded polystyrene, commodities, issued after this notification, shall come into force after the expiry of ten years, from the date of its publication."
- 5. In the said rules, in rule 5, in sub-rule (1), in clause (d), for the figures "2000", the figures "2016" shall be substituted.
- In the said rules, in rule 6, in sub-rule (2), after clause (a), following clause shall be inserted, namely: -
 - "(aa) ensuring that the provisions of these rules, as amended, are adhered to;".
- 7. In the said rules, in rule 7, in sub-rule (1), after clause (a), following clause shall be inserted, namely:
 - "(aa) ensuring that the provisions of these rules, as amended, are adhered to,"
- 8. In the said rules, in rule 9, in sub-rule (1), after the words, "local body concerned", the words "as per guidelines issued under these rules from time to time" shall be inserted.
- In rule 11, sub-rule (1), -
 - (i) after the words "plastic carry bag", the words, "plastic packaging" shall be inserted:
 - (ii) in clause (a), after the word "manufacturer", the words "producer or brandowner" shall be inserted, and after the words "carry bag", the words "and plastic packaging used by the brand owner" shall be inserted;
 - (iii) in clause (b), after the words "multilayered packaging", the words "excluding multi-layered packaging used for imported goods" shall be inserted;
 - (iv) in clause (c), after the words "name and certificate number", the words "of producer" shall be inserted.
- 10. In rule 12,
 - (i) in sub-rule (2), after the words "waste generator," ,the words "restriction or prohibition on" shall be inserted;
 - (ii) in sub-rule (3), after the words "waste generator," ,the words "restriction or prohibition on" shall be inserted.

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11. In rule 13, in sub-rule (1), after the words "Union Territory concerned", the words "or the Central Pollution Control Board" shall be inserted.

SPCBs/PCCs for phasing out Single Use Plastic (SUP).

It is brought to your kind notice that the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change (MoEF & CC) notified the PWM Rules, 2016, in exercise of the powers conferred under section 3, 6 & 25 of the Environmental (Protection) Act, 1986 vide notification no. G.S.R. 320 (E) dated March 27, 2016 Further, MoEF&CC issued notification dated August 12, 2021 which mandated banning of identified SUP items and prescribed minimum thickness of carry bag with effect from July 01, 2022.

As per Rule 4 (2) of PWM Rules, 2016 (as amended), "The manufacture, import, stocking, distribution, sale and use of following single use plastic (SUP), including polystyrene and expanded polystyrene, commodities shall be prohibited with effect from the 1st July, 2022;

(a) Ear buds with plastic sticks, plastic sticks for balloons, plastic flags, candy sticks, icecream sticks, polystyrene (Thermocol) for decoration.

(b) Plates, cups, glasses, cutlery such as forks, spoons, knives, straw, trays, wrapping or packing films around sweet boxes, invitation cards, and cigarette packets, plastic or PVC banners less than 100 microns, stirrers.

It is further intimated that CPCB has issued Directions u/s 5 of the EPA, 1986 for phasing out of Single Use Plastic vide letter no. no. B.17011/7/UPC-II-PWM(SUP)/2022 dated 01.02.2022 (enclosed herewith).

The direction mentioned at Sr. no. 9 is reproduced as under:

"To inform Hon'ble Chief Ministers / Ministers and all the public representatives at different levels as also all the officers at different levels".

As such, it is requested to kindly apprise Ministers/MLAs/MPs and all the public representatives at different levels as also all the officers at different levels in your District regarding prohibition on use of identified Single Use Plastic items w.e.f 01-07-2022 in compliance to the notification issued by MoEF&CC on 12-08-2021.

The Action Plan detailing the Action Points (including those to be executed by State level Authorities) along with the time lines is enclosed with this letter; and

Now, therefore, in view of above and in exercise of powers vested under Section 5 of Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 to the Chairman, CPCB following directions are issued for compliance:

To be executed directly by SPCBs/PCCs

 To revoke/modify (as applicable) Consents and Registration issued to producers engaged in production of banned SUP items.

 To direct the producers engaged in production of banned SUP items to take necessary action to ensure zero inventory of banned SUP items before July 01, 2022.

3. To direct plastic raw material manufacturers in your State/UT:

a. Not to supply plastic raw material to producers (in formal / informal sector) engaged in production of banned SUP items.

b. To ensure that suppliers/ stockists/ dealers and other entities engaged in the industry's supply chain do not supply plastic raw material to producers engaged in production of banned SUP items.

4. To direct E-Commerce companies to discontinue selling of banned SUP items as per the timelines specified in the said Notification.

 To issue a Public Notice in your state/UT apprising the stakeholders to comply with the provisions of the Notification, dated August 12, 2021.

6. To convene a meeting with Local Authorities (District Magistrate, District Police & Urban Local Bodies & others) to apprise them of their roles &

7. To direct the concerned State Authorities for the following:

i. District-wise identification of major Commercial Establishments (Malls/Market place/ Shopping Centres/ Cinema Houses/ Tourist Locations/ Schools/ Colleges/ Office complexes / Hospitals & other Institutions) and Stockists/ Retailers/Sellers/Importers of banned SUP items/Street Vendors/Vegetable & Fruit Markets/Malls and other similar entities which are dealing in bulk in the aforementioned single use plastic items

ii. To sensitise through workshops/webinars the aforementioned identified entities and to direct them to take necessary action to ensure zero inventory of banned SUP items by July 01, 2022.

iii. To take necessary action, including cancellation of commercial licenses issued, against the identified entities if found violating stipulated

conditions.

iv. To issue fresh commercial licenses to major Stockists/ retailers/ sellers/ and Commercial Establishments with the condition that they shall not be stocking/selling/using banned SUP items.

v. To frame local bye-laws for levying Environmental compensation in line

with CPCB Guidelines for violation of stipulated conditions.

8. To organize a meeting / webinar/workshop of all the key stakeholders - key Ministries directly or indirectly involved or associated with the production, storage, distribution, stocking and sale of banned SUP items which could be the Ministry of Urban Development and Housing, Ministry of Local Self Government, Ministry of Rural Development and Panchayati Raj, Ministry of Transport, Ministry of Tourism, Ministry of Industries, Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises, Ministry of Women & Child specially that related to production, distribution and sale of items made by Self Help Groups; other Ministries and Departments as deemed appropriate as well as key Associations and Industrial Organizations

9. To inform Hon'ble Chief Ministers / Ministers and all the Public Representatives at different levels as also all the officers at different levels

10. To conduct field inspections in association with District Magistrate, District Police & Local Urban and Rural Authorities to eliminate stocking, sale &

usage & as per format placed at Annexure II.

11. To identify SUP Producers engaged in production of banned SUP items in informal sector/ suppliers of plastic raw material to such producers through contact tracing / public notice /public grievance reporting etc. & initiating action against them in association with local authorities.

12. To provide information for Mapping of District in each State/ UT as per format

provided in Annexure II for the SUP App being developed by CPCB.

13. To coordinate with State Authorities to ensure grievance raised in the SUP App or any other similar App available with the local authorities are resolved in a time bound manner. RO, SPCB concerned shall coordinate with local authorities to resolve the grievance till details as per "10' above are provided and the source/origin of banned SUP items are traced and action is taken against the defaulters.

14. To take penal action/ levy EC on violators of stipulated conditions of the said

Notification.

To be executed through other Agencies/ Organizations

15. To provide necessary assistance for convening of training programs of MSMEs involving CIPET, CPCB and MSME State Institute to facilitate transition from SUP to alternatives by MSMEs.

16. To conduct Market survey through third party agency to phase out banned SUP items as per format placed at Annexure II.

17. To submit a detailed Awareness Program for elimination of SUP alongwith timelines including directions mentioned above and to incorporate other State specific initiatives as deemed appropriate by Chairperson, SPCB.

18. To take further necessary action to eliminate SUP in your State/UT as per the

timelines specified in the said Notification.
