Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing to you to draw your attention to the work Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS), National Standards Body of the country, is doing, and how it can help the district administration in becoming an active partner in creating a robust quality eco-system in the country, as envisaged in the Indian National Strategy for Standardization (INSS).

2. You may be aware that BIS is the National Standards Body mandated under the BIS Act, 2016 to formulate Indian standards for products, processes and services covering different sectors of economy, and is also responsible for devising and implementing Conformity Assessment Schemes, which involve Certification and Factory & Market Surveillance, to monitor the implementation of the standards.
3. BIS has developed more than 20,000 Indian Standards of which around 50% relate to products and others to the test methods, code of practices etc. BIS has developed e-BIS, an integrated portal (www.manakonline.in), covering various aspects of the functioning of BIS; like, Standard Formulation, Conformity Assessment, Compulsory Registration Scheme, Hallmarking, Laboratory Information Management Scheme, Management System Certification Scheme, Foreign Manufacturers Certification Scheme, Training etc. The complete list of published Indian Standards can be seen by selecting the Standardization Portal in e-BIS; and the standards can be downloaded and their prints taken free of cost.
4. As can be seen, on the Standardization Portal, the standards have been arranged both Department and Technical Committee-wise and Group-wise. You can select a Group and drill down to Sub-sub Group level. For example, if you select the Group: Agriculture, Agricultural Products and Implements, 7 Sub-Groups will appear, showing the number of Standards against it. In the Sub-Group for "Fertilizers including biofertilizers" there are 65 standards. Selecting this Sub-Group leads to its 4 Sub-sub Groups, indicating the number of Standards against each of them. We can see the details of a Standard by clicking on the number and downloading it after logging into the portal. There is also the feature to comment on the standard, if someone has a suggestion for improvement in the standard. A specific standard can also be searched by typing the product name in the search option.

5. It is eminently desirable that Government Officers implementing Government programmes and schemes are aware of the Indian standards. It will help them understand the products and processes to be used for qualitative improvement in the execution of the programmes and schemes. For example, if a building construction programme is taken up, the officers concerned must know if there are Indian standards for Cement, bricks, steel bars, concrete mix etc. and ensure that the products which are compliant with the corresponding Indian standards only are used for construction. It implies that whenever any bid is invited for any purpose, it should be incumbent upon the officer concerned to ensure that the bid document refers to the appropriate Indian standard, and the bidders are asked to submit documentary proof in this regard. The quality of the works, whether they relate to road or building infrastructure, irrigation, minor or micro irrigation, drinking water supply, drainage systems, electrical installations, or supply of items to schools, Anganwadi Centres or hospitals, will witness a significant improvement through the use of such quality products.

6. It merits mention here that Standards are essentially voluntary in nature. BIS Act, 2016 provides, however, that the Central Government can make any of the Indian standards mandatory for compliance through a Quality Control Order (QCO). Standards for 337 products have so far been made mandatory for compliance. The details of QCOs and the standards and products covered under them can be seen at the BIS website (www.bis.gov.in). The effect of the QCO is that no one can manufacture, import, sell or exhibit a product covered thereunder without a license from BIS. There are punitive measures provided in the BIS Act for violation of this requirement. The list of licenses issues against the Standards under Compulsory Certification may also be seen at the BIS website.

7. A manufacturer can also obtain a BIS license for a product not covered under QCO. Of around 36800 licenses issued by BIS so far, 15370 pertains to products under mandatory certification and 21430 to products under voluntary certification. The complete list of BIS licenses can be seen at the Conformity Assessment Portal of e-BIS. There are filters provided in the Portal for accessing the details of licenses Region and Branch Office wise, Category-wise (Voluntary/mandatory), Indian Standard-wise and product-wise. What one has to do is to select the 'Total Licenses' on the Conformity Assessment Portal and use the appropriate filter to get the desired information. There is also the facility 'Search your license' on the portal. By typing out the IS Number, if known, or product name, one can see all the licenses issued in respect of that Standard/product. The list of QCOs and standards and covered under them have also been made available at the BIS Website and the BIS Care App.

8. These features on the Conformity Assessment Portal will enable the district-level officer to learn about the BIS licenses and manufacturers who have been granted licenses. They can accordingly decide their procurement programmes.

9. It also needs to be pointed out that even if no license is granted against a standard, but it is felt that the product required for the programme implementation should be compliant to the Standard, the bidders may be asked to supply only ISI-marked products. They will, in that case, be forced to obtain the BIS license and comply with the quality parameters laid down in the standard. It will go a long way in creating demand for quality goods in the country.

10. I would like to introduce the BIS Care App at this stage. This Mobile App has been developed to help the consumers verify the authenticity of an ISI-marked product, an article of hallmarked jewellery and an electronic or solar photovoltaic equipment bearing a R-number, and to lodge complaint with BIS in case a fraud is detected. It can be downloaded on any android-based set from the Google App Store. Every ISI-marked article has a CM/L-Number i.e. the License Number. A consumer can verify if the product is genuinely an ISI-marked one by selecting 'License Details' and typing out the CM/L-Number. If it is a genuine product, the App will display the complete details of the license; and if it is not so, it will display 'No such license exists'. Similar kinds of checks can be exercised by selecting 'Verify Hallmark' or 'Verify R-no. under CRS'. Complaint can also be registered directly through the App from where it automatically gets reflected under the Complaint Management System of BIS.

11. There is a need for creating adequate awareness about BIS Care App not only among the Government Officers, but also among the masses. Since the district administration deals with a variety of grass-root level organizations, like Self-help Groups, School Management Committees, Village Health & Sanitation Committees etc., and has a large network of field level offices, it can play an important role in carrying the knowledge about the App and its utility to a large body of consumers.

12. Hallmarking of gold and silver jewellery and artefacts is an important responsibility assigned to BIS; and you may be aware that Hallmarking of gold jewellery and artefacts would become mandatory with effect from 1st June, 2021. Under this scheme, every Jeweler selling gold jewellery and artefacts has to register himself with BIS, and every piece of gold jewellery or artefact, weighing 2 g & above, manufactured, imported, sold or exhibited in the country has to be hallmarked by an Assaying & Hallmarking Centre recognized by BIS. As part of e-BIS, Hallmarking Portal has been developed to facilitate online registration of jewelers and recognition of Assaying & Hallmarking Centres. Details of the portal. The information may be obtained State-wise, Branch office-wise, and District-wise.

13. District Administration can play an important role in ensuring that the benefit of the scheme reaches the largest possible number of consumers. As was mentioned above with regard to the BIS Care App, it can use the grass-root level organizations and its network of field offices to create awareness about the scheme. Secondly, educational institutions can be used to educate people about the provisions for the gold jewelers to display their Registration number and relevant details, check the authenticity of Hallmarking, and registration of the complaints, and the grievance redressal mechanism available to them. A detailed document containing all the relevant information about Hallmarking has been placed at the Hallmarking Portal. Thirdly, local entrepreneurs can be encouraged to take the benefit of the scheme of financial assistance for setting up an Assaying & Hallmarking Centre if the district does not have a single such Centre. The details of the scheme can be accessed at the Hallmarking portal.

14. The National Institute of Training for Standardization (NITS) of BIS at Noida conducts various kinds of training programmes, residential and non-residential, for the professionals associated with Standard Formulation, Conformity Assessment, Laboratory Operations, Hallmarking, Consumer engagement etc. from both government and private sectors. Training programmes are provided both classroom-based and online, and NITS imparts customized training programmes too, based on the requests from the organizations. These are normally paid programmes, details of which can be seen on the Training portal of e-BIS. You may find many of these useful for the district-level officers; and send the request for a customized training programme too. BIS has a network of 32 Branch offices, details of which can be seen at the BIS Website. Training programmes can be organized at the Branch Office or even at the district level. BIS does not charge anything except the expenditure on essential logistical arrangements for field-based training programmes aimed at capacity-building of the government functionaries.

15. An indicative list of products that may be of interest to the district administration is appended to the letter for ready reference.

16. To conclude, I would like to request you to use the Indian Standards in all your programmes and activities, and approach us for any assistance you need for the capacity-building of the officials or promotion of the Standards.
